Next session around 11:30 presentation of Small Businessman of the Year award to Domenic Donatello of Anchorage, Alaska in the Rose Garden. His family was there. Took 200 mm. lens and tried to take color.

After that went in with George Reedy and Bill Moyers, took just a few shots in the office.

Then around 12:30 the Pres. saw His Excellency Amintore Fanfani, ~~Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Italy~~, an old friend of the President, from way back. They had a short session in the office, then went out for a walk, called the Press and the Press photogs. Where I missed a picture. I want to be sure to take long ~~angle~~ angle shots of the Press photogs when they are running for the President, on one of these walks. In the past I've been concentrating on just the President. But I'd like to get some action shots when they're all on the run running toward him.

Then they went back into the office and had a session with Fanfani, the interpreter from the Italian embassy and the Italian Amb. Dick Davis from State, and a very bright young Negro from State (get name from Marie Fahner). The Pres. then introduced Fanfani to the reps. of US News and World Report who were waiting for him in the cabinet room, then walked Fanfani out to the car.

Then he immediately went to lunch up in the Mansion with members in US News and World Report. I took a few pix in the West end of the Bldg. and then left.

AT THE WHITE HOUSE

WITH GEORGE REEDY

12:00 NOON EDT

MAY 27, 1965

THURSDAY

MR. REEDY: The President met with bipartisan Congressional leaders at 10:15 to review with them the international situation on a far-ranging scale. It was one of his periodic meetings to keep Congress informed of all developments affecting the policies of this Government.

Secretary Rusk and Secretary McNamara briefed the leaders on the world situation. The two secretaries covered the political and military situation in Southeast Asia, including Viet Nam, in Europe, in Africa, and in Latin America, including the Dominican Republic. Mr. Bundy reviewed for the leaders his trip to the Dominican Republic and the conclusions drawn therefrom. The members of Congress were given a full opportunity to question the officials who had briefed them and to make suggestions. The floor leaders left at 11:45 to open the session and the others remained for a further question and answer session.

Q. Are they still there?

MR. REEDY: Yes.

Q. Where was this held, George?

MR. REEDY: In the Cabinet Room. The further question and answer session was still going on when I was there.

Q. Can you tell us who was there?

MR. REEDY: Those present included the Vice President, Senator Mansfield, Senator Long, Senator Hayden, Senator Fulbright, Senator Smathers, Senator Dirksen, Senator Kuchel, Senator Hickenlooper, and Senator Aiken.

Q. Was Senator Saltonstall there?

MR. REEDY: He was invited but he was unable to attend.

The House members included Speaker McCormack, Congressman Albert, Congressman Boggs, Congressman Rivers, Congressman Mahon, Congressman Ford, Congressman Arends, Congressman Bates, and Congressman Bow.

Q. George, were any prospective actions discussed, such as a further build-up of American forces in Viet Nam?

MR. REEDY: All I will say about that is that it was a very full discussion. I am not going to go into the details beyond the point that I have.

Q. Is this the first one of those periodic meetings that has been called since we have gone into the Dominican Republic?

MR. REEDY: I'd have to check the record on that, Chuck.

MORE

Q. Did any of the Congressmen take advantage of the opportunity to make suggestions about Viet Nam and other subjects?

MR. REEDY: Yes.

Q. Not merely questions, but suggestions?

MR. REEDY: Yes, I said they had an opportunity to make suggestions.

Q. Did they?

MR. REEDY: I'm not going to go into what happened. They had a full opportunity and I am not going to go into the discussion beyond that.

Q. Is there any discussion about what the President might say at Baylor?

MR. REEDY: No discussion on the speech.

The President is going down to Texas tonight. He will go to the ranch tonight, and he will be in Austin in the morning.

Q. To unveil the portrait, George?

MR. REEDY: Yes. I'll have further details on that for you later. He will go to Baylor for this commencement address tomorrow morning. Then back to Austin. I do not have a schedule beyond this, but I will try to have a more complete background for you.

Q. Back to Austin or back to the ranch?

MR. REEDY: I don't have that yet.

Q. Is the President planning to use that office this weekend?

MR. REEDY: I don't have any schedule beyond what I have given you.

Q. Do you know what this Austin thing is?

MR. REEDY: I said I'll get you further details.

Q. Do you have a rough idea of a departure time?

MR. REEDY: I can't give you a time yet, Bill, but I would believe it will be following this reception for congressional aides. I'll try to get you a time. The reception is at 7 o'clock.

Q. Is Mrs. Johnson going?

A. She will be going down tomorrow. She has a certain ceremony.

Q. Do you think he will leave in the 9 o'clock area?

MR. REEDY: There is no sense in guessing at this point, Smitty.

Q. Can you say that he's going to spend the weekend, or hopes to?

MR. REEDY: No, I can't at this point. We'll have to wait until we get a complete schedule.

Q. Does the press plane leave after him?

MR. REEDY: We'll try to time it about the same.

MORE

Q. What time does the President make the speech at Baylor?

MR. REEDY: 11:30 is the last time I have, Smitty.

Q. You do not have a destination for him after that?

MR. REEDY: He will return either to Austin or the ranch.

Q. Do you have any deadline on baggage?

MR. REEDY: Let's make it 6 o'clock.

Q. Do you anticipate his remaining in Texas later than Monday morning?

MR. REEDY: I have no schedule beyond what I have given you so far, Smitty. You will just have to wait.

Q. Are we going to have a briefing on those bills? I'm not asking for one, but they said there would be?

MR. REEDY: I have Mr. White here who can handle any questions on that. Does anybody have any questions of Mr. White on this matter?

Q. Why don't we do that after?

Q. Will that reception tonight be covered?

MR. REEDY: I'll give you that later.

Let me add one other thing. This ceremony for the Arms Control and Disarmament Act was moved back to noon, and obviously it is going to be somewhat later. I'll get word to you as soon as I can.

Q. Do you have any information for us on the unveiling?

MR. REEDY: I'll have everything for you by 4 o'clock.

Q. Was the President present throughout the session this morning?

MR. REEDY: Yes.

Q. Can people begin setting up for the Arms Control ceremony? Can the camera crew start setting up?

MR. REEDY: No, I'll give you the word on that as quickly as I can.

THE PRESS: Thank you, George.

Chamber. Names of two men who unveiled painting: Sen. Bill Moore and (other names on list he is bringing in) Lt. Gov. Pat Smith accepted portrait for Senate. Jake Jacobsen knows all the people and he will identify them for us. Then when Pres. was giving his speech the room was so fascinating to me I started covering all around. Dashed upstairs to try to get shot and speech ended and I got stuck with Press photogs and couldn't get around to the room where the Pres. was and he was asking for me and I was stuck outside. Learned lesson on these trips never get out of sight. Finally got up in elevator to Gov.'s office where I took a few pix.
