

All your letters I love to get. But the ones in your own hand-writing, that are often love letters these days, are the ones I read over and over. Darling, I want to answer one paragraph in the letter written Sunday afternoon: I am happy; I am lucky; I am much stronger than the girl I was a few years ago; I feel capable of handling whatever happens to us with ultimate happy and constructive conclusion; and I wouldn't trade you for a combination of Charles Boyer-the richest Rockefeller-and MacArthur.
