Scope and content note:

The files pertain to Lyndon B. Johnson's Senate leadership role as the Democratic Majority Whip in 1951 and 1952, Democratic Minority Leader in 1953 and 1954, and Democratic Majority Leader from 1955 to 1961. The files include correspondence, including letters and telegrams; memorandums; minutes of Democratic Conference and Policy Committee meetings from 1953-1960; notices of meetings; statements, speeches, and tributes; press releases; publications and printed material, including telephone directories for U. S. Senators; clippings and magazine articles; lists; notes, and work papers. The series includes incomplete correspondence files, 1956-1959, from the Democratic Policy Committee which Lyndon Johnson chaired as the Senate Democratic Leader; a sub-series of Policy Committee staff memorandums, 1957-1960; a sub-series related to Senate Committee appointments, 1951-1960; a sub-series related to the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee, 1952-1957; and a sub-series of correspondence with Democratic Senators, 1957-1959, as well as a sub-series of correspondence with Republican and Democratic members of the Senate for 1959 and 1960. The series also includes topical sub-series dealing with Senator Joseph McCarthy, 1954; the Bricker Amendment, 1952-1954; and civil rights, 1960. The series also contains correspondence files related to President Eisenhower's order for U. S. troops to enforce school desegregation in Little Rock, Arkansas, against the wishes of Governor Orville Faubus; responses to a telegram sent to members of Congress by Washington correspondent for the New York Post, Robert Spivack inquiring about their opinion of Democratic Congressional leadership, July 1959; and other topics of public interest such as support for the Murray-Metcalf bill to provide education funding for schools, 1959; and teamster leader Jimmy Hoffa and labor racketeering, 1959.

MISCELLANEOUS PAPERS OF THE MAJORITY WHIP, 1951-52. 1 inch. Box 362.

The file includes newspaper clippings, January 1951, relating to Mr. Johnson's election as Whip; copies of a Colliers magazine article, "The Whip from Texas," February 17, 1951; notices of meetings; copies of Senate Documents relating to the accomplishments of the 82nd Congress; a telegram from Senators Lehman, Douglas and Humphrey; a Senate telephone directory; and constituent mail referring to the tribute paid Mr. Johnson by the Majority Leader on the floor of the Senate on July 7, 1952. (Mr. Johnson has distributed copies of Congressional Record reprints of the Majority Leader's remarks.) The folder of correspondence is titled "McFarland's Tribute." See also the title "General - Special Information on 82nd Congress, 1st Session" in box 219.

MISCELLANEOUS PAPERS OF THE MINORITY LEADER, 1952-54. 4 inches. Boxes 362-63.

The papers include staff memoranda, press releases, and newspapers clippings relating to Mr. Johnson's election as Leader; letters of congratulation; copies of statements of accomplishment of both Sessions of the 83rd Congress and other Congressional documents; lists of names and telephone numbers, proposed job descriptions for Policy Committee staff members and a telephone directory of U. S. Senators.

MISCELLANEOUS PAPERS OF THE MAJORITY LEADER, 1955-60. 4 inches. Box 363.

The papers include statements of accomplishments of the Sessions of Congress and related memoranda and work papers; work papers relating to the voting records of individual Senators, copies of Mr. Johnson's statements and releases, newspapers clippings, and telephone directories of U. S. Senators.

PAPERS RECEIVED FROM THE DEMOCRATIC POLICY COMMITTEE, 1953-60. 2 inches. Box 364.

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In 1967, the White House obtained copies of minutes of Democratic Conference and Policy Committee Meetings for the years President Johnson served as the Democratic Leader. These copies have been placed with the Senate papers pertaining to Mr. Johnson's role as party leader.

FRAGMENTS RELATING TO THE DEMOCRATIC CONFERENCE, 1953-61. ½ inch. Box 364.

The fragments include carbon copies of minutes of meetings, January 4, 1955, and January-February 1960; a December 1953 memo from two staff members; copies of Mr. Johnson's statements and remarks, 1953 and 1958-60; and public opinion mail relating to his statements to the Conference on January 7, 1958. For minutes of other Conference meetings, see "Papers Received from the Democratic Policy Committee," in box 364; these are described above.

FRAGMENTS RELATING TO THE DEMOCRATIC SENATORIAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE, 1952-57. ½ inch. Box 364.

The fragments consist of copies of statistical statements of Committee receipts and disbursements for the period 1952-55 and summaries of the statements; minutes of a meeting, February 4, 1957; copies of statements made by Committee members; memoranda; and a copy of a report titled "Background and Voting Records on Dey Issues Affecting the Public Power and Reclamation Policy of the United States, 1947-52."

FRAGMENTS RELATING TO ASSIGNMENTS MADE BY THE STEERING COMMITTEE, 1951-57. ½ inch. Box 364.

The fragments include correspondence, memoranda, releases, lists, and copies of "Confidential Work Sheets." (Confidential Work Sheet No. 1 listed the requests of Senators for standing committee assignments, and Confidential Work Sheet No. 2 listed the current committee assignments.) Fragments from 1951 are in one folder; the 1953-57 fragments are in another. The 1951 fragments were originally in an annotated envelope which is now a part of the file.

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CORRESPONDENCE OF THE POLICY COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN RELATING TO COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS, 1953-60. 3 inches. Boxes 364-65.

The file includes correspondence with Senators, the Vice-President, and the Secretary of the Senate; copies of State Department documents, Senate and House resolutions and releases; and interoffice memoranda relating to the appointment of Senators as members of boards commissions, ceremonial committees, and as delegates and advisers to international conferences.

CORRESPONDENCE WITH DEMOCRATIC SENATORS, 1957-59. 1 foot. Boxes 365-368.

The correspondence relates to committee and subcommittee assignments and activities, to legislation, and to Senate procedure. It includes enclosures such as newspaper clippings, statements, releases, and printed copies of congressional documents. The folders are arranged alphabetically by the name of the Senator; the folders for Senators Dodd, Douglas, Fulbright, Humphrey, and Kennedy are missing. Three additional folders at the end of the file contain copies of (1) letters of the Democratic Leader to the President about Senate matters, (2) courtesy copies of letters from Senators to Charles McCabe, publisher of the New York Mirror acknowledging receipt of an editorial about Mr. Johnson, and (3) letters of thanks from Senators for committee assignments. "REPLIES TO SPIVACK TELEGRAMS," July 1959. 1 inch. Box 368.

Robert G. Spivack, Washington correspondent of the New York Post, sent a telegram to the Democratic members of Congress on July 10, 1959, asking their reactions to criticism of the Democratic congressional leadership allegedly made by the Chairman of the Democratic National Committee and asking their opinions of their leaders. The members sent Mr. Johnson copies of their replies to Mr. Spivack. The file consists of copies of the replies and copies of Mr. Johnson's acknowledgement. The Kennedy letters have been sent to Mrs. Territo and are filed in the White House Famous Names File.

CONGRESSIONAL CORRESPONDENCE, 1959. 1 foot. Boxes 368-370.

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The correspondence includes Senator Johnson's letters to and from members of Congress pertaining to legislation, public relations (such as invitations and birthday greetings) , and personal matters; a few newspaper clippings and brochures; and copies of "thank you" letters sent to Democratic and Republican members of the Senate and the House at the end of the Congressional Session. Included are a few documents dated 1958 and 1960 and some correspondence with Senate staff members. The correspondence is in 25 alphabetically arranged folders. See also the LBJA Congressional File.

CONGRESSIONAL CORRESPONDENCE, 1960-January 19, 1961. 2 feet. Boxes 370-74.

The file includes Mr. Johnson's correspondence with and about members of Congress and state legislatures, Supreme Court Justices, and Senate staff members, pertaining to legislation, public relations (such as invitations, birthday greetings, and election congratulations), and personal matters. Included are newspaper clippings, tear sheets, and brochures. The correspondence is in 25 alphabetically arranged folders. See also the LBJA Congressional File.

SPECIAL FILE RELATING TO THE MCCARTHY CONTROVERSY, 1954. ½ inch. Box 374.

The "McCarthy controversy" refers to the conduct of Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, a Republican member of the Special Investigating Subcommittee of the Senate Committee on Government Operations. The Senate was enraged by his reckless accusations in his investigations of alleged communism in government, particularly during hearings held by the Special Subcommittee. After the Subcommittee hearings had closed, the Senate began to take steps that ultimately led to the censure of McCarthy. The Policy Committee held a meeting on July 29 to discuss Democratic strategy. The following day Republican Senator Ralph Flanders introduced a resolution to establish a bipartisan select committee to look into the matter, and on August 5, the Democratic Leader announced the names of the Democratic Senators chosen to be members of the Select Committee.

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The fragments in this file consist of minutes of the July 29 Policy Committee meeting; a letter from the National Committee for a More Effective Congress that was referred to in the minutes; undated handwritten notes that appear to have been written at the meeting; copies of Mr. Johnson's statements and releases; memoranda; a record of an undated telephone conversation between Senators McClelland and Johnson; correspondence; and a clipping, November 20, 1954. For public opinion mail, 1953-54, see the title "McCarthy" in the General Files in boxes 498 and 521-524.

FRAGMENTS RELATING TO THE BRICKER AMENDMENT, 1952-54. ½ inch. Box 374.

The fragments include copies of Senate Joint Resolution 1, Senator Bricker's proposed Constitutional amendment relating to treaty making; interoffice memoranda commenting on the proposed amendment and analyzing Mr. Johnson's mail on the subject; copies of Mr. Johnson's press releases; a newspaper clipping; and a letter of November 17, 1952, relating to Senator Bricker's proposal together with a copy of the reply. Other public opinion mail on this subject apparently was destroyed.

FRAGMENTS RELATING TO CIVIL RIGHTS, 1960. ¼ inch. Box 374.

The fragments include memoranda from Gerald Siegel, Harry McPherson, and others; a copy of a Roy Wilkins telegram dated March 4, 1960; a list of participants in the January 13-14 Legislative Conference, and memoranda.

POLICY COMMITTEE STAFF MEMORANDA, 1957-60. 1 inch. Box 375.

The memoranda filed here were found loose and unidentified with Policy Committee material and have been organized chronologically; they concern a variety of topics. A folder of undated, unsigned memoranda is filed at the end of the series. Most of the unsigned memoranda appear to be from George Reedy.

UNIDENTIFIED POLICY COMMITTEE MATERIAL, 1950-60. 2 inches. Box 375.

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A variety of material was found loose and unidentified with Policy Committee files and with the Office Files of George Reedy. Most of the items were filed in appropriate places, but a few could not be readily identified. These were arranged chronologically; undated items are filed at the end.

PRINTED MATERIAL, 1950-60. 3 inches. Boxes 375-76.

The pamphlets, reprints, magazine articles, handouts, and other printed material were in unfolded unidentified Policy Committee files and probably belonged to staff members. The last three folders contain printed sheets which were probably prepared by the Policy Committee itself.

POLICY COMMITTEE CORRESPONDENCE, 1956-58. 4 feet. Boxes 376-387.

The file consists of letters, telegrams, leaflets, and brochures, which were sent to Senator Johnson from "out of State" and answered by the Policy Committee staff. Although predominately from 1957 and 1958, some correspondence is from 1956. Letters are arranged alphabetically in folders by the name of the organization or the individual correspondent. The file designation is written in red on the right edge of the outgoing letter. The mail covers a variety of topics, but much pertains to legislation, resolutions, confirmations, and senate investigations. Notations on the original folders and boxes indicated that the file had been screened.

POLICY COMMITTEE CORRESPONDENCE, 1958. 1 ½ feet. Boxes 387-91.

The file contains letters, telegrams, leaflets, and clippings sent to Senator Johnson. Arranged in twenty-five alphabetical folders, correspondence is chronologically filed within folders. Unlike Policy Committee letters in boxes 376-87, these contain no file designations on the right edge of the letters. The original labels indicated that these boxes had not been screened.

POLICY COMMITTEE CORRESPONDENCE, 1959. 6 inches. Boxes 391-92.

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The correspondence is in twenty-four alphabetical folders; there is no folder for the letter I. Besides letters and telegrams, the file contains a few clippings and other enclosures sent to Senator Johnson. The file designations are written in either red crayon or in pencil on the right edge of the correspondence. Notations on the original box labels indicated that the file had been screened.

POLICY COMMITTEE CORRESPONDENCE, 1958-59. 8 inches. Boxes 392-94.

The series includes a folder of correspondence with the Democratic National Committee and thirty-five folders of other correspondence arranged alphabetically from Macomber, William B. to the letter V. File designations are written in red crayon or pencil along the right edge of correspondence. Notations on the original box labels indicated that the file had been screened.

"FAUBUS FILE," September-December 1957. 7 inches. Boxes 394-95.

In the fall of 1957, when President Eisenhower ordered troops into Little Rock to enforce school desegregation, against the wishes of Orville Faubus, Governor of Arkansas, Senator Johnson received much mail concerning the incident. This correspondence is divided into six folders, one favorable to Eisenhower, one neutral, and four opposing Eisenhower. Letters opposing Eisenhower are arranged by the first letter of the correspondent's name, and are further broken down chronologically; neutral and favorable mail is arranged chronologically. The file includes a few clippings which are attached to the senders' letters.

POLICY COMMITTEE LETTERS THAT WERE ANSWERED BY FORM LETTERS, 1958-59. 4 inches. Box 396.

The collection includes incoming letters answered by form letters.

PUBLIC OPINION CORRESPONDENCE FILED BY SUBJECT, 1959. 3 inches. Box 397.

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The correspondence includes telegrams dated June and July 1959 endorsing S. 2, the Murray Metcalf Bill relating to school construction and teachers' salaries; letters dated April and May 1959 relating to James Hoffa; letters dated April 1959 relating to a medal for Secretary of State John Foster Dulles; and letters dated May 1959 relating to the nomination of Mrs. Clare Booth Luce as Ambassador to Brazil. The mail appears to be unanswered.

UNANSWERED POLICY COMMITTEE LETTERS, 1959. 8 inches. Boxes 397-98.

The file includes anonymous and crank letters, letters with incomplete addresses, and pressure mail. The mail is arranged chronologically from January 1959 through September 1959 by date of receipt.
