Biographical sketch:

Walt Whitman Rostow was an educator and government official who served as the Deputy Special Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs in 1961. From 1961 to 1966, Rostow was Counselor and Chairman of the Policy Planning Council of the Department of State. He also served as the U.S. Representative to the Inter-American Committee for the Alliance for Progress from 1964 to 1966

This collection contains materials created and gathered by Walt Rostow throughout his career in government and academia. Included are materials created while on staff at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and The University of Texas at Austin; the State Department; and the White House under Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson.
