Biographical sketch:

Arthur W. Barber (b. July 4, 1926, Meriden, Connecticut), served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Internal Security Affairs for the Department of Defense from 1962 to 1967.

Scope and content note:

The papers of Arthur Barber consist of three memorandums describing his recollections of incidents that occurred while he served with the Department of Defense in International Security Affairs (ISA). His memorandums describe his memories related to the an investigation by Al Friedman, Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for ISA of the attack in the Gulf of Tonkin, Vietnam, in August 1964; a speech by President Johnson about building bridges to trade with Eastern Europe; and President Johnson's proposal for a freeze on nuclear weapons.
