A relatively quiet day. I had expected to attend the memorial services for Winston Churchill at the National Cathedral this morning at 11:00. But Lyndon didn't feel like going and I can only claim laziness or desire not to leave him for cancelling myself. Lynda went and represented us along with the Humphreys.

I spent a lot of the day working with staff members, Bess, Simone, Liz, Dorothy Territo. Exposing her to the fast jumble of invitations, notes, dinner programs that's in the bottom right hand drawer of my desk and has been accumulating since 1947. She must have felt she found a gold mine! Luci talked to me about her mail. She has gotten about 300 letters about taking instructions in the Roman Catholic Church. She says they are about 10 to 1 against it. She is quiet incensed and emotional about a letter, a Protestant Minister, a Presbyterian I think, who said pretty articulately, that she was doing her family an injustice and her Episcopal church.

About 4:30 Lyndon put on his clothes and went over to his office, Although he is still not feeling

well and the sweating persists. He is just not bouncy like himself. I went to try to retrieve him and it was getting a little past eight. We came home and had dinner, just the two of us, and a rather early dissipated bedtime. I had been using my day constructively, however. I read the report by Lyndon's Task Force on Beautification of which Laurence Rockefeller and Ken <sup>Cabrera</sup> ~~Galby~~ are members. I also tried to call off and on all day to pin down appointments with Mr. <sup>Tosburgh</sup> ~~Ferber~~ to talk about White House art; to Robin; to Mary Lasker to talk about both White House art and the beautification project; Mr. Laurence <sup>a</sup> Rockefeller whom I am really looking forward to get to know better, to see me the day after the state dinner which he is attending, to talk beautification. And to Tom Watson, of IBM.
