MAYOR DALEY:

Marvin, How are you doing. Did we do all right yesterday. In unity there is strength? Marvin, he is a sound young aggressive young man that will carry when they ask him - you know we asked every candidate - this is off the record - whether you would wholeheartedly support the Presidents policy and he said, "I was a soldier in World War II and a member of the Democratic party and I'll carry Johnson's banner any place any where." I think he is doing right. The Vietnam situation - I've been in war none of us want war, but no one wants peace more than the President. And he said no one has fought for peace more than the President and he said I also found out one thing in my own household and my own family I have always felt that you had to stand up at times and have some courage. If people were trying to do the wrong things to you. We have a unified ticket all unified behind the President. I'm calling you up - you can help us if you get the appointment of the Governor out of the way and send it up to the Senate so that we can - he asked that it be held until yesterday, in his customary way he didn't want to be charged with making any move that would influence the slate makers, but now that move is made Marvin and it would help us a hell of a lot if we could get our fellow in as Governor right away and get him out of the way as Judge. Would you work on it?
