CONVERSATION BETWEEN W. MARVIN WATSON AND
MAYOR DALEY, Wednesday, March 13, 1968, 12:25 p.m.

WATSON: Mr. Mayor.

DALEY: Marvin.

WATSON: The President is in a Cabinet Meeting. Can he call you back. Let me ask a question or two while I've got you. What did you think about New Hampshire?

DALEY: Well I think it was a warning to us. I don't think it is going to let anyone phoh-phoh it or - you know - it's something that no one expected to happen.

WATSON: Yes sir.

DALEY: This is what I want to talk to him about. I think we have to do some things about it.

WATSON: All right, sir.

DALEY: Fine, Marvin.

WATSON: I also ...

DALEY: All these guys - you know they tell nice things - they tell you what you want to hear. You can be just listening to them, but its not good when you let this guy get this kind of a vote -- then there is something we've got to do.

WATSON: All right sir, one other thing. I'm beginning to hear rumors and rumbles that possibly Bobby Kennedy will announce this week.

DALEY: That's right. I want to talk to him - if something can be done to head that off, '

WATSON: All right.

DALEY: ... if we do certain other things.

WATSON: You think he may do it this week.

DALEY: Well, yes -- when I talk to the other fellow ...

WATSON: All right, thank you Mayor.
