A. Arthur, how are you?

B. I am fine.

A. We have moved ahead some, and I think we will work out an announcement today if that would suit you, or we could go over until the early part or middle of next week, and try to have a little joint announcement at a little meeting kind of like we do when people are leaving over here. I don't know how your situation is. If you feel it ought to be done as early as possible from your standpoint, we could do it today. George Christian is out. He picked up a bug. Tom Johnson is here though, and I thought I would call you and see if you feel as you did yesterday.

B. Mr. President, I did not want to get into all these personal things. They are strictly personal. If it could be done, I would appreciate it. If you were so disposed -- next week, if you are kind enough to do what you suggest, Dorothy and I will be grateful.

A. Well, we will do this today and try to work out the other later. I will get in touch with U Thant. I will talk to the Secretary, and see when he is available. I will get back to you.

B. That will be fine. I will be at my office.
