This is the President's telephone call from
Governor Nelson Rockefeller in New York at
9:35pm , June 7, 1968.

B. - Mr. President, this is Nelson. Say, I don't know whether it would be convenient with you, but I want to be very frank from my point of view -- I would be very happy to have the opportunity sometime of stopping by and talking with you about the situation generally under the new circumstances, the questions of unity, and so on.

A. - At any time you want to see me, it is always convenient.

B. - You are wonderful, Mr. President.

A. - You just tell Jim Jones any time you want to see me. If you want to come Monday

B. - I could come down from Pennsylvania Monday. I have to be there. I will be there Monday.

A. - Just figure out any time, any day, what is best for you.

B. - You are great. It will be very helpful. I just want to discuss some things.

A. - Come in for a briefing or discuss anything you want to.

B. - If I come down I will probably follow up on that briefing. I will have Ann Whitman call about the appointment.

A. - Just let Jim Jones know when you can come.

B. - You are the greatest friend. I will see about Monday.
