B Mr. President?

A Yes, Senator.

B Oh, Ted Kennedy.

A Yes.

B I just wanted to thank you again for everything you have done, and of all the help of all of your people. It made everything much, much easier. You're very kind, and terribly helpful. You were awfully good to us, so we're very, very much appreciative. I'm just up here with my parents now -- up in Massachusetts -- Mother was very much touched by your first call and by your tender care. So I just wanted to let you know on behalf -- I know Ethel called you -- but I wanted to let you know that my parents appreciate it, and we are indeed very grateful to you.

A Thank you, Ted. I wish there was something more that I could do and we were all terribly distressed, as you are, and I just wish I could share more of it with you.

B You are very very kind and terribly helpful and very very much appreciated.

A We did everything we knew, and we want to, always.

B We're grateful for all of it.

A You're very thoughtful to call, and give your father and ~~my~~ mother my love.

B I certainly will. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
