On the president's instruction a painting of President Roosevelt had been hung in the Cabinet Room -- painting was a portrait of President Franklin D. Roosevelt by Armando Drechsler (commissioned and presented to President Roosevelt by President Manuel Avila Camacho of Mexico, in 1941, this portrait was painted in the Executive Office while the President worked at his desk. The portrait is half length seated at a desk (on which is a small potted cactus) apparently making a "fireside chat." The right quarter of the canvas is red as if reflecting a fire although the fireplace is not shown. Abe Fortas and Fred Lazarus were with the President when he saw it for the first time. ~~Jaunia Roberts~~ As the President walked into the Cabinet room and first saw the painting a smile crossed his face, but as he got near the picture he shook his head and said, "No, that is not the picture, there's no comparison. This is the one I like (pointing to Sallzburg)!" Then he asked, Abe Fortas and Lazarus what they thought. They agreed with the President. He then directed ~~Jaunia Roberts~~ rehanging the Sallzburg painting. Jaunia Roberts ~~said~~ recounted that President Roosevelt used to point to this picture and say, "There I am in hell." The group laughed. And the President said, "They'll be saying that about me."

9:17 p.m. Dr. Carmichael introduces the President of the United States.

9:28 p.m. Dr. Carmichael adjourns the ceremony.

9:30 p.m. The U. S. Marine Band plays the National Anthem.

For the President's Diary - January 22

1. 8:30 a.m. -- the President instructed Secretary of Defense McNamara to have plans ready for any contingency in Panama. If a coup is used, let us have detailed plans prepared for it.

2. Prepare compromise language that is acceptable to the Peace Commission.

3. Go forward with all dispatch for plans for new Canal -- the cost, the techniques and time schedule, the geography -- and have these prepared immediately.
