				The President reviewed his speech -- he suggested some changes particularly to emphasize the result of nuclear fallout on our children. He referred portions of his speech to the attention of Michigan Gubernatorial candidate, Cong. Neil Staebler and in turn read Staebler's prepared remarks at the latter's request. He discussed Staebler's campaign with him and suggested to him the need for emphasizing his capacity as an Administrator rather than his purely partisan views, in order to overcome Staebler's current problem of more than 20% Democratic defection.	
				The President also discussed Appalachia w/Sen. McNamara - pointing out the Senate should have passed this bill weeks ago and urging McNamara to join with Sen. Randolph and the Democratic Leadership to accomplish passage now.	
				The Pres. and Mrs. Johnson discussed various aspects of the campaign including the need to beef up the distribution of material. The NY Daily News poll and polls generally were discussed. The Pres. and Mrs. Johnson expressed concern about complacency in the campaign and Mrs. Johnson made the comment that she might decide it was necessary to circulate the Walter Winchell poll to overcome complacency. - Larry O'Brien solicited individual comments from

	11:50a			Departed the Sheraton-Cadillac Hotel by car and motored to Cadillac Square. Enthusiastic crowds lined the streets on the parade route from the hotel to the square. More than 100 thousand people greeted them in the square under clear skies and a hot sun.	
				The President was introduced by Walter Reuther - Gov. George Romney was on the platform along with some 100 labor and civic leaders.	
	12:00n			REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT at Labor Day Rally in Cadillac Square - concluded @12:27 pm.	
				After the speech, Mayor Cavanaugh presented Pres. Johnson with a hollow bronze statuette of the "Spirit of Detroit" sculptured by Mr. Marshall Fredericks, 440 Lake Park, Birmingham, Mich.	
				Also following the speech the Pres. walked for some distance shaking hands with hundreds of people as he had done outside the hotel and at the airport.	
	12:40p			Departed Cadillac Square by car - accompanied by Walter Reuther and motored to Detroit Metropolitan Airport - arr'g @1:09 pm - where again the Pres. personally greeted many in the crowds.

				Midway in the trip the President removed his coat and shoes and rested on the sofa for the remainder of the trip. He changed his shirt upon landing.
