	9:17			Arrive Sheraton Hotel, went directly to the West Ballroom to listen to Secretary Udall introduce dignitaries present. Senator Morse introduced the President. The President acknowledged 35 seconds of applause and then ADDRESSED the Northwest Public Power Association and the Northwest Electric Association.	
	9L59a			Outside the Sheraton Hotel, the President took time to greet the <del>xxx</del> crowds. At 10:05 he departed the Sheraton Hotel via motorcade with the following in his limousine: (SS Rpt does not give names of those riding in car - yb)

	10:15a			Impromptu stop to Shriners Crippled Children's Hospital . There were 88 <sup>Children</sup> kids in the hospital, 40 girls, and 48 boys, and the President gave them pencils and medallions. As he left, the girls chorused, "Thank you for coming."	
	10:30			Again, motorcade to airport, arriving at 10:45	
	10:50			To Sacramento, California via AF #1 -- the President called the members of Congress aboard and Secretary Udall into his cabin. He visited briefly with the press in the main cabin.	
	12:00			Arrive Sacramento, California Municipal Airport. Greeted by Governor and Mrs. Edmund Brown, Lt. Governor Glen Anderson, Mayor James B. McKinney, Speaker Jesse Unruh, and Fred Barbaria, Chairman of the Sacramento Board of Supervisors. Approximately 5-6,000 people were at the airport, and he went along the fende to shake hands with some of them.	
	12:15			Motorcade to <del>Sacramento</del> State Capitol of California, making one stop along the way to get out of the car and shake hands with a large group waiting to greet him outside the gates of Sacramento City College -- he arrived the Capitol at 12:45pm	
				The President made ADDRESS on Capitol steps, having been introduced by Governor Brown. Following the address, the President and the Governor proceeded to a room near the Governor's office for a LUNCHEON, hosted by the Governor. WH staffers, Reedy, Bundy, Clifton and Valenti attended. The President made short remarks and Senator Salinger responded.	
				Each person at the table was asked to stand up and introduce himself. The President carried on a running commentary at lunch with almost everyone there... re vote getting in various states to the political siutation in Souther California . <del>The Press</del>

				At the luncheon Gov. Brown presented the President with a memento of his visit -- a pair of cufflinks with the seal of the State of California on them. (Paul Glynn has the cufflinks for the President's use)	
	2:30			Via motorcade to Aerojet-General Co. - w/ the following accompanying him in his limousine: <i>(not on SS Rpt - yet)</i>	
	3:32			He stopped three times en route to shake hands with crowds, once at a Catholic School, and twice at shopping centers. Arrived Aerojet to watch the successful firing of a TITAN III Production Engine, First Phase, from the control Room. The Press and some staff members watched from an outdoor bleacher arrangement. <i>on a special television monitor setup. Received engineer's hat, "The President," and was made an honorary test engineer.</i>	
	3:45			Departed the Control Room, making one stop near the main entrance of Aerojet to shake hands with workers, and then made another stop just outside the gates of Aerojet Plant. Arrived Mather AFB at 4:30, and greeted the crowds there.

	6:00			Arrive Salt Lake City Utah Municipal Airport. Met at the foot of the plane in warm 81 degree temperature by Senator and Mrs. Frank E. (Ted) Moss and President Eldon Tanner, one of the Presidents of the Church of the Latter Day Saints (Mormons). The President got into a blue Mercury convertible with the top down, and sat on the truck with Senator Moss as he drove closely along the fende to wave to the crowds waiting to get a glimpse of him.	
	6:10			The President changed to a closed Lincoln automboile and departed the airport in the company of Senator and Mrs. Moss and President Tanner. Good crowds lined the path to the Hotel Utah, which was hardly expected. . because the visit had been announced only one hour and ten minutes before <del>on xxxxxxx</del> his arrival. Radio spots and television announcements had been used to notify the people of Salt Lake of the President's impending visit.	
	6:30			The President arrived the Hotel Utah. After shaking his hands and making his way through the crowd, he got on a waiting elevator and went directly to the eighty floor suite of President of the Mormon Church, David O. <del>McKay</del> McKay is <del>xxx</del> recuperating from a serious heart attack. The President met with President McKay from 6:35 to 6:48 in the company of Senator Moss, Secretary Udall, President Tanner. (report of meeting coming from President's/McKay's secretary -- contact: Lem Johns)	
	6:49			The President walked 30 feet and entered Room 822 -- a small ordinary room which had been hastily secured for the President's use. The staff milled around in the hall. In the room, the President showed Senator Moss a copy of an editorial from the Salt Lake Tribume, and asked him his opinion on whether he should call one or two of the officials. Sen. Moss suggested that he call Mr. J. W. Gallivan
