He told them that the Mexicans really like him and that he was very well received in El Paso. He also talked of the days when he talked for a living -- public speaking -- and when he taught it at school and won the state championship. He emphasized over and over that a politician ought to talk to the people that don't like you instead of the ones that do like you to prove to them that you are what you are and not always what the press people and newpapers play you up to be. Following the discussion on public speaking! the President re-emphasized the importance of the polls and how they are rating throughout the nation. A question-answer period followed that discussion with the press asking questions on the President's wealth, how he felt on the reliability of polls, etc. The President also talked of how a President's problems are most often inherited -- and comments on how the press has called him a "crook" and a "no good bastard". Then comments on Secretary' McNamara's importance in the Defense Department and the nation. He said that the big issues were -- peace -- communism, -- and peace again. Going back to the Cabinet members, he reiterated that he does not want to lose any of them and that instead wants to keep the "most reliable, competent, best-qualifed group of men that he has long come in contact with.
