THE PRESIDENT HAS APPROVED THE FOLLOWING:

## October 3, 1964

- S. 1082, An Act to establish in the Treasury a correctional industries fund for the government of the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.
- H. R. 2501, An Act to authorize the promotion of qualified Reserve officers of the Army and the Air Force to existing unit vacancies.
- H. R. 2509, An Act to authorize Reserve officers to combine service in more than one reserve component in computing the four years of satisfactory Federal service necessary to qualify for the uniform maintenance allowance.
- H. R. 2512, An Act to clarify the status of members of the National Guard while attending or instructing at National Guard schools established under the authority of the Secretary of the Army or Secretary of the Air Force, as the case may be, and for other purposes.
- H. R. 2753, An Act to disclaim any title of the United States to certain real property in Modec County, California.
- H. R. 2859, An Act to provide for the promulgation of rules of practice and procedure under the Bankruptcy Act, and for other purposes.
- H. R. 9435, An Act to improve judicial procedures for serving documents, obtaining evidence, and proving documents in litigation with international aspects.
- H. R. 10328, An Act for the relief of certain commissioned officers of the Army or Air Force who were erroneously paid uniform allowance under the provisions of section 305 of the Career Compensation Act of 1949, as amended, and for other purposes.
- H. R. 12033, An Act to further amend the transitional provisions of the Act approved September 6, 1958, entitled "An Act to protect the public health by amending the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to prohibit the use in food of additives which have not been adequately tested to establish their safety", and for other purposes.
