10:00					Arrived First Presbyterian Church of Phoenix -- entered the church w/ Mr. Roy Elson and Mr. Goddard (Mrs. Elson and Mrs. Goddard were unable to enter the church because of the size of the crowd inside.) (The Minister of the Church had already begun the services that were scheduled to begin at 9:30 am) Presiding was Charles R. Earhardt, D.D.	
10:30					The services ended and the President and his party (incl. General Clifton) departed from the building. Outside of the church -- people were lined all up and down the and were roped off from the entrance to the church. When the President emerged wild cheering and running occurred. A microphone was given to the President and the President spoke for about 10 minutes. ....this was broadcast over the radio The President gave away gold pens -- LBJ --	
10:50					The Presidential motorcade departed for the airport -- arriving at 11:30 am. The streets were lined w/ people all along the route .....the President stopped his car on several occasions -- mainly outside of churches -- (they had just adjourned from the Sunday morning services)..... Negro churches, Mexican churches and any all along the route that there was a large gathering outside of On some street corners, the President stopped -- and stood on the trunk of the SS car -- waving and shouting to the people -- (Not many Goldwatersigns were in evidence at all). At one of the stops -- a woman rushed up with a sign that she had saved since the 1960 Presidential campaign -- the President had it held up and shouted that she should save it for 1968 when he would be back. The motorcade arrived at the entrance to the airport -- and more well-wishers were again at the airport -- The President stopped and waved and shook hands with them. By this time, because of the strenuous hand-shaking, his hands were ripped by

	8:30				Arrived at Convention Center -- w/ him in the car were:
