	4:15				Departed via chopper for Andrews AFB w/ Marvin Watson, Jack Valenti, Horace Busby, Joe Keenan (AFL-CIO), Dr. Allen Isen, GW (GER & VM aboard choper #2) Arriving at 4:24 pm.	
	4:25				Departed Andrews AFB aboard AF-1, 26,000 w/ above staff and also Senator Stephen Young, Mr. Bill Geoghan (fr. Justice Dept.)	
	4:35				The President went into the passenger compartment and visited with the Press Pool	
	5:35				Arrived <u>GREATER CINCINATTI AIRPORT, OHIO</u> (Covington, Kentucky -- Cinc. is across the river and into Ohio)	
(time chge.) 1 hr.					The President was greeted at the airport by Governor Ed Breathitt, Congressman Frank Shelf, Brent Spence, Former Congressman, Frank Paxton, Campaign Chmn. A speaker's platform was set up for the President to speak from on the airport grounds. Governor Breathitt introduced the President (approx. crowd - 1800 - police est)	
	4:47	5:07			REMARKS -- (As the President spoke, signs were visible supporting the President. A few original ones were also in sight -- "Papa Bird" "Barry Scary")	
	5:09				The President went to his car -- w/ Senator Stephen Young, Mr. Vincent Beckman (Co. Chmn. for Hamilton County -- Cincinnati) ... and the motorcade proceeded.	
	5:25				Arrived at the proper city limits of Cincinnati -- bands were on hand to greet the President with music and crowds were on hand to supply the wild cheering and waving. They were at least 3 and 4 deep along the streets that led to the speaker's platform at Fountain Square.	
	5:30				The Presidential motorcade arrived Fountain Square. On the platform with the President were: Senator Stephen Young, Robert Sweeney, Candidate for Congress at Large, Jack Gilligan, Cand. for Congress, Harry Sand, Candidate for Congress, Vincent Beckman, Chmn. for Hamilton County, Dr. Albert Sabin, Co-chmn for Johnson; Al McNamara, Co-Chmn. for Johnson	
	5:38	5:51			REMARKS --- The police estimated the crowd to be 75,000 Mr. George Gallagher (advance man) said that the crowd was 3 x the size of President Kennedy's in 1962 and 2x the size of President Kennedy's in 1960. (he had accompanied the President on both of those trips -- '60 and '62). He also commented that it was larger than President Eisenhower had ever received.	
	5:52				After ending the President's remarks, the President went into the crowds to shake hands and to greet the people.

	5:55				The Presidential motorcade departed the Square en route to the airport, arriving at 6:15 pm	
	6:20				AF-1 departed Greater Cincinnati for Dayton, Ohio	
	6:55				The Presidential aircraft arrived at <u>DAYTON, OHIO</u> and the President was greeted by an approx. crowd of 8,000-10,000 people (police est.)	
					The President and Sen. Stephen Young entered the President's limousine and departed for Dayton, Ohio city limits.	
	7:15				The motorcade was at this point still proceeding along the designated route. ... crowds were very large along the street and the President was sitting on the car door w/ the window down so that he could wave at the crowds... While the President was waving... Agent Youngblood was in contact w/ the other cars -- via radio -- in particular the lead cars-- he would issue orders on speed at which to travel and whether or not to have sirens, etc..... A sign said, "Johnson Wax Shines Better than Goldwater"....	
	7:35				Entered the city limits -- huge crowds were at the airport lining the routes. ... signs said -- "Labor Backs LBJ".... "All The Way with LBJ".... etc.	
	7:39				At the corner of 2nd Street and Main Street.... the President stopped his car and climbed atop it -- again for the purpose of waving and smiling at the people. at 7:42 the motorcade proceeded, again with the President hanging outside of the car window (The President was in a regular Lincoln sedan and not the bullet-proof one)....	
	7:43				Arrived at the County Court House -- (3rd and Main Streets)	
	7:46				The President mounted the platform -- and waved to the cheering crowds. The National Anthem was played and then the invocation was given. Democratic State Chmn. Wm. Coleman spoke. Senator Stephen Young, who in turn introduced the President.	
	7:56	8:28			As the President was introduced, chanting began -- "L. B. J." REMARKS ---during the speech -- there were 43 applauses, 5 periods of chanting "LBJ" and three comments that drew laughter from the audience.	
	8:32				Before the motorcade departed, the President climbed on top of his car and waved to the throngs of people -- then departed.... amidst cheering.	
	8:35				Motorcade stopped -- climbed atop his car -- and talked to the people... hands were madly waving in the air in an attempt to touch the President's hand at 8:38 proceeded.

The President stopped for 2 minutes -- was on top of his car -- waving and smiling -- and then moved on. plane	
	9:04				The motorcade entered the service road leading to the spot where the car was parked. The crowds had remained at the airport to bid the President farewell	
	9:07				The President boarded the aircraft and immediately went into the passenger compartment to invite the Press Pool, GER, HB, and JV to enter his stateroom -- where he chatted with them and then invited them to have dinner with him.	
h. e)	11:30				Arrived at Andrews AFB -- rain was pouring heavily -- and the presidential party had to travel into Wahington via motorcade. In the President's limousine were Marvin Watson, JV, Horace Busby, XGW, and VM and Agent Younblood.	
	12:00				Arrived at the South Grounds and went to the office -- The President signed mail and at 12:40 told VM that she could go home.
