C	10:35				Departed WH via chopper w/ Mrs. Johnson, Jack Valenti, Liz Carpenter, Marvin Watson, VM arriving at Andrews AFB at 10:54 am....and boarded AF-1, 26,000 for Dover, Delaware. Guests aboard the aircraft were: Governor Elbert N. Carvel of Del.; Cong. Harris B. McDowell, Jr; Chief Justice Chas. Terry, Jr., cand. for Governor; Dr. Allen Isen, Staff: JV, Marvin Watson, GER, Liz Carpenter, VM	
C	11:15				Arrived at Dover AFB and deplaned at 11:17.....w/ Mrs. Johnson, Cong. McDowell, Chief Justice McDowell, Governor Carvel. The President and the First Lady walked along the fence line shaking hands w/ airmen and their families. The President was greeted at the Air Base by Colonel David E. Daniel, Cmdr. of 1607 Air Transport Wing, MATS and Colonel Lloyd R. Humphries, Base Commander	
	11:26				The President, Governor Carvel, Congressman Harris McDowell, and Chief Justice Terry entered the car for the ride into proper Dover. Along the motorcade route, the President would lean outside of the car to wave at the people.....but the motorcade did not stop for the 4.5 mil.	
	11:41				Arrived State Building area--- and proceeded to the Old State House where the President freshened up in the Custodian of Delaware Commission of Shell Fisheries (Samuel J. Fox)'s room. The Party then proceeded on to the speaker's platform	
	11:50				On the speaker's stand outside of the State House -- w/ the President on the platform were: (cand. for Sen.) Gov. Elbert Carvel, Congressman Harris McDowell (up for re-election); Chief Justice and Mrs. Charles Terry (cand. for Governor), Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Erickson, Raymond West, Suffix County Democratic Chmn., Francis Downs, Asst. Secy. of State, Dr. Mishoe, President of Del. State Univ.; Honorable and Mrs. Allan Frear (former U. S. Senator) As the President went on the speaker's stand, chants of "We Want Johnson" and "Hello, Lyndon" was sung w/ a band accompanient -- the President was introduced by Governor Carvel --	
	12:00	12:29			REMARKS (19 applauses) After the speech, the President and Mrs. Johnson shook hands w/ the band members and some of the people lined up along the fence line in front of the speaker's platform.	
	12:35				Departed Old State House -- the President and First Lady decided to walk the fence line along the drive leading up to the State House -- He had band-aids applied to his tender hands and took out after the people -- waving, smiling, and handshaking. Mrs. Johnson walked down one side and the President down the other. There were about 10 girls dressed in costumes -- "Ladies for Lyndon"....the President shook hands w/ them, also.

	12:57				The President and Mrs. Johnson got into the open car and talked and waved to the people while the motorcade proceeded. The President would shout into the bull horn -- "Don't forget to vote on November 3"	
	1:00				Motorcade stopped for the President and Mrs. Johnson to change back into the enclosed limousine. As the cars stopped, the President got out and went into the crowds and signed autographs and got kissed by young girls that grabbed onto his neck and planted large kisses onto him.	
	1:03				Arrived at Dover AFB -- and immediately boarded the plane.	
					Official crowd estimate at speech - 6, -8,000 ----- at route -- 1 - 3,000 (by police chief)	
	1:07				Wheels up for Wilmington, Delaware The President went to the press pool and asked GER what the crowd estimate was....then to the stateroom for take-off w/ Governor Carvel, Cong. McDowell, and Judge Terry.	
	1:30				Arrived WILMINGTON, DELAWARE airport. Deplaned at 1:43 Crowds and bands <del>th</del> greeted the President and First Lady and their party Mayor John E. Babiarez and Elisha Dukes greeted the party. On the platform w/ the President : Elisha Dukes -- State Democ. Chmn. and MC; Gov. Carvel, Cong. McDowell, Chief Justice Terry; Sherman Tribbitt -- <del>W</del> Speaker of House and Cand. for Lt. Governor; Belle Everett -- State Treasurer; Mayor John E. Babiarez; Charles Moore -- cand. for State Auditor; Wm. S. Potter -- Nat'l. Committeeman; Michael Poppiti -- Democ. City Chmn. ; Francis A. Dolan -- New Castle Democ. Co. Chmn.; Clement Lemon -- Pres. of Delaware State Labor Cabinet; Judge Sidney Clark (friend of Louie Martin)

	3:15				Arrived Republic Airport -- <u>FARMINGDALE, LONG ISLAND</u> 3:30 -- Deplaned //3:30 to Abe Fortas (LD call) The President was met by Honorable and Mrs. Robert Kennedy	
	3:45				Motorcade began through Nassau County -- approx. 12 miles -- crowds lined the Boulevard the entire way. Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy rode in the <del>his</del> car w/ President and Mrs. Johnson -- they all wved the entire route -- but did not stop once.	
	4:57				Arrived Elmont -- where a helicopter site had been arranged -- They posed for pics in the car and then boarded the chopper (just President and Mrs. Johnson)	
	5:00				Departed Elmont for Wall Street Heliport w/ Mrs. Johnson, Marvin Watson, Jack Valenti, Sgt. Glynn and VM arriving at Wall Street at 5:12 pm. Cars were waiting for the Party and they proceeded to the Waldorf-Astoria	
	5:30				Arrived at Waldorf-Astoria and immediately went to the suite. Eddie Weisl, Sr. and Commissioner Patterson greeted the President -- and went into his room w/ him for talking while the President got a rub. The President then went into the dining room where he had finger sandwiches for supper and back into his bedroom for ice cream Mr. Alfred Strelsin, Mr. Frank Levein, and Mr. Harry Gould also came by to say hello to the President. //5:43 LD t Secretary Dean Rusk The President napped in his bedroom until approx 8:00 when he went down to the Louis XVI room for a taping -- political w/ 4 ladies among them Mrs. Ovetta Culp Hobby	
	10:25				The President invited the ladies to go with him to Madison Square Gardens -- arriving at 10:35 As the President and Mrs. Johnson entered the Garden (Luci, Lynda, and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kennedy were already there for the entertainment that had proceeded the President's speech) a tremendous ovation took place for 10 minutes.....there followed screaming and hollering for the President -- "We Want Johnson".....etc. Mayor Robert Wagner introduced the President	
	10:45	11:10 p	EST		REMARKS (54 applauses)	
	11:20				Departed Madison Square Gardens for John F. Kennedy Airport arriving at 11:50. The President was in an extremely jocular mood and talked w/ the press pool the entire trip back to back to Washington, D. C.
