	8:40				<u>Awake</u> Dr. Burkley reported that about 9:30 am this morning in the President's bedroom, two hyperkeratotic areas on the dorsum of the President's right hand, one in the region of the second finger, were removed by bovie-cautery. The material removed was retained for microscopic examination. The area was dressed with an antibiotic salve and a simple bandaid over each denuded area. Physicians performing minor surgery were: Dr. Burkley, Capt. Gustave T. Anderson, chief of dermatology at Bethesda; Dr. Peter Hovarth, prof. of dermatology at Georgetown Univ.; Capt Triel, USN was standing by -- he is a plastic surgeon -- just in case his services were needed.

He stopped the car, opened the door, and took Him with him on the ride to Georgetown. The motorcade arrived McDonough Field House Gymnasium. The President went into a locker room and w/ the aid of Sgt Gaddis he took off his jacket and donned academic robe. He spent a few minutes looking over his speech, and then departed the locker room. He went into the gymnasium and mounted the platform -- the program had already commenced -- and it was interrupted by "Hail to the Chief" announcing the arrival of the President. Music was provided by the U. S. Army Band. The National Anthem was played and sung by the Georgetown Glee Club. The President listened to the invocation, and to Dr. Edward B. Bunn Dr. Edward B. Bunn, S. J., as he delivered remarks prior to the inauguration of the Very Reverend Gerard J. Campbell, S. J., as 44th President of Georgetown Univ. He read a listing of the charter of the University and the mace... he described each one of these and then turned them over to the new President, Father Campbell. Father Campbell received the tokens and delivered his address. He announced that Father Bunn is going to stay on at Georgetown as Chancellor. The program proceeded w/ recording by Maestro Pablo Casals, Conferring of honorary degree posthumously on President Kennedy -- received by Mrs. Eunice Shriver.
