	6:00				The President was in his bedroom in bed and he asked that Dr. Burkley come to see him about a toe that was bothering him. (Dr. Burkley reported that it looked as if the nail had been cut improperly, thus causing discomfort.) While in the room the Dr. took the President's blood pressure -- at the same time delivering a stern lecture to the President on a better regulation of his schedule --and evidencing displeasure on the President's being up so late during the current period caused by critical events in VietNam -- and the President's blood pressure reading was 132/76 -- <del>xanax</del> which is normal. The President -- as a result of Dr. Burkley's lecture -- remarked to someone over the telephone, "My Doctor is mad at me." However, Dr. Burkley was chagrined because the blood pressure was at a normal reading, and he had no ammunition to carry his stern admonition further.
