NOMINATIONS SENT TO THE SENATE ON APRIL 1, 1965:

Alexander B. Trowbridge, of New York, to be an Assistant Secretary of Commerce.

Walter M. Kotschnig, of Maryland, to be the Representative of the United States of America to the Twentieth Plenary Session of the Economic Commission for Europe of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations.

Morris B. Abram, of New York, to be the Representative of the United States of America on the Human Rights Commission of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations.

The following-named persons to be Members of the United States Advisory Commission on Information for terms expiring January 27, 1968, and until their successors have been appointed and qualified:

Palmer Hoyt, of Colorado
Morris S. Novik, of New York (Reappointment)

Henry H. Fowler, of Virginia, to be United States Governor of the International Monetary Fund for a term of five years; United States Governor of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development for a term of five years; and a Governor of the Inter-American Development Bank for a term of five years and until his successor has been appointed, vice Douglas Dillon.

Having designated, under the provisions of Title 10, United States Code, Section 5231, Rear Admiral Luther C. Heinz, U. S. Navy, for commands and other duties determined by the President to be within the contemplation of said section, I nominate him for appointment to the grade of vice admiral while so serving.

William B. Dale, of Maryland, to be United States Executive Director of the International Monetary Fund for a term of two years. (Reappointment)
