					Today released a memorandum from Secy of Defense McNamara detailing actions taken by the Dept of Defense in support of the President's War on Poverty.	
					Sent message to the Congress asking for an additional \$89 million for the Agency for Intl Development for expanded programs of economic and social development in Southeast Asia. -- and released statement upon sending the message up.	
					Called a White House Conference on Education, chaired by John W. Gardner, to be held in Washington on July 20 and 21.	
					Announced that he hoped to address the General Assembly of the UN at its commemorative assembly in San Francisco on June 24, 25, and 26.	
					Released statement calling attention to the very effective and selfless emergency relief work done by representatives of our government in cooperation with the OAS	
					Ordered the immediate withdrawal of one battalion landing team of U. S. Marines plus headquarters and support personnel, totaling approximately 2,000 personnel from the Dominican Republic	
					Budget Bureau reported to the President that civilian employment in the executive branch was down 4,698 from April 1964 and 17,719 below April 1963	
					Budget Bureau reported to the President that federal agencies aided the drive to improve the United States balance of payments position by reducing civilian employment in foreign countries more than six per cent in 1964.	
					Released text of his ltr to the VP and the Speaker urging passage of legislation to implement the Florence Agreement.
