C	4:32	CST			Arrived O'Hare International Airport, Chicago, Illinois w/ party.	
C	4:43				Disembarked the Jet Star w/ Luci and Senator Paul Douglas The group stood on the steps of the plane and posed for pics -- Then to the landing -- and was greeted by a Reception Committee including: Governor Otto Kerner Mayor Richard Daley, Colonel Riley (Daley's asst.) and local dignitaries Bands played "hail to the Chief" and crowds were lined and crowded up behind the fence. The President and Luci moved through the Reception Committee receiving line -- and then to the fence to shake hands w/ the well-wishers (Luci has developed a new greeting - as she shakes hands w/ people - dignitaries - she does a small curtsey)	
	4:47				Departed O'Hare Airport -- in motorcade - accompanied by Luci, Governor Otto Kerner of Ill., Sen. Paul Douglas, and Mayor Richard Daley (JV in the front seat)	
					The Presidential motorcade drove all of the way into town (and back out that evening) for 2 reasons: (1) Mayor Daley had requested that the President arrive early so that he could arrive at the loop at around 5:00 so that the workers of the downtown area could line the streets and greet the President and Luci (2) The expense of transporting the Presidential party from O'Hare to the heloport downtown would cost too much (this trip paid for by the DNC), and the President wanted to save as much as possible on expenses, for the DNC	
					The motorcade stopped under a sort of tunnel (covered by the bridges overhead - the freeway), and unfurled the flags of the President's car, and 2 SS agents moved to the panels on the back of his car.	
					In town -- the crowds were 3 and 4 thick along the streets and on the sidewalk w/ signs stating from which Ward the supporters were representing -- welcoming the President to "Daley's Chicago" and supporting the President's policies in the DR and Viet Nam

1	5:35				Arrived at the Conrad Hilton Hotel -- where huge crowds were both inside and outside of the Hotel to see the President. The President and Luci moved from side to side shaking hands and smiling and waving to all.... Then into the Hotel -- where more well-wishers were gathered (held back by Chicago police -- and to the elevator accompanied by Gov. Kerner and Sen. Douglas and Mayor Daley.	
	5:45				In the Imperial suite -- w/ Gov. Kerner, Sen. Douglas, and Mayor Daley -- (Staff: GER, MW, JV, VM), Luci and Bill Hitchcock.	
	5:55				Gov. Kerner, Mayor Daley, and Sen. Douglas left the suite	
					The President sat in his suite - visiting w/ GER, JV, MW, and VM	
					Mayor Daley later came up to tell the President that in front of the Hotel, a group of foreign nationals (Poles, Hungarians, Czechs,) were gathered to entertain the President and anyone that would look. The President went to the window and watched them dance and sing in their native costumes.	
					The President also noticed the abundance of baseball parks that were being used by the youths in front of Lake Michigan, and commented that "Daley was sure doing his part in keeping the kids off the streets."	
	7:00				The President greeted Governor Otto Kerner, Mayor and Mrs. Richard Daley and their sons, and a group of dignitaries in the Cook County Demo Party in his site who were to escort him to McCormack Place for the reception and dinner	
	7:10				The President departed the Hotel w/ Luci, Sen. Douglas, Gov. Kerner, and Mayor and Mrs. Daley and motored to McCormack Place arriving at 7:20 pm.	
	7:20				To a Reception given by the Cook County Demo Party -- the President, Luci, and party moved through a double receiving line -- greeting again the dignitaries of Chicago and leaders of Wards and Demos from Chicago (committeewomen and men, etc.)
