The National Labor-Management Panel, consists of twelve members appointed by the President, six representing management and six representing labor. Their task is to advise the Director of the Federal Mediation Service (William Simkin) and the President on the best manner of reaching voluntary settlements of disputes between labor and management. There is no salary.
