THE PRESIDENT HAS APPROVED THE FOLLOWING:

JUNE 24, 1965

- S. 856, An Act for the relief of the estate of R. M. Clark.
- S. 1000, An Act to amend the Act of July 29, 1954, as amended, to permit transfer of title to movable property to agencies which assume operation and maintenance responsibility for project works serving municipal and industrial functions.
- H.R. 214, An Act to amend section 2104 of title 38, United States Code, to extend the time for filing certain claims for mustering-out payments, and, effective July 1, 1966, to repeal chapter 43 of title 38 of the United States Code.
- H.R. 1732, An Act to extend the Act of September 26, 1961, relating to allotment and assignment of pay, to cover the Government Printing Office, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 8464, An Act to provide, for the period beginning on July 1, 1965, and ending on June 30, 1966, a temporary increase in the public debt limit set forth in section 21 of the Second Liberty Bond Act.
