President Johnson today announced his intention to nominate for reappointment two U.S. Attorneys and five U.S. Marshals, all for four-year terms. They are:

John O. Garaas, of Fargo, North Dakota, to be United States Attorney for the District of North Dakota.

Claude Vernon Spratley, Jr., of James City County, Virginia, to be United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia.

Robert F. Morey, of Boston, Massachusetts, to be United States Marshal for the District of Massachusetts.

Orville H. Trotter, of South Rockwood, Michigan, to be United States Marshal for the Eastern District of Michigan.

Hugh Salter, of Raleigh, North Carolina, to be United States Marshal for the Eastern District of North Carolina.

Frank W. Cotner, of Washingtonville, Pennsylvania, to be United States Marshal for the Middle District of Pennsylvania.

Charles N. Bordwine, of Abingdon, Virginia, to be United States Marshal for the Western District of Virginia.
