THE PRESIDENT HAS APPROVED THE FOLLOWING:

July 7, 1965

- H. R. 3994, An Act to remove the present \$5,000 limitation which prevents the Secretary of the Air Force from settling and paying certain claims arising out of the crash of a United States aircraft at Wichita, Kansas.
- H. R. 3996, An Act to amend provisions of law relating to the settlement of admiralty claims.
- H. R. 4525, An Act to amend the Merchant Marine Act, 1936, to provide for the continuation of authority to develop American-flag carriers and promote the foreign commerce of the United States through the use of mobile trade fairs.
- H. R. 6507, An Act providing for penalties for arson under anti-racketeering
- H. R. 6848, An Act to amend section 35 of title 18 of the United States
 Code relating to the imparting or conveying of false information.
