The President had decided upon the passage of the Bill, that it would be most fitting to sign it w/ Former President Harry Truman who did so much during his Administration in instigating Health measures for the people of this country (senior citizens, etc.....)

- S. 627, An Act to exempt oceanographic research vessels from the application of certain vessel inspection laws, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 1217, An Act for relief of Captain Paul W. Oberdorfer.
- H.R. 1374, An Act for the relief of Chief Warrant Officer Elden R. Comer.
- H.R. 1487, An Act for the relief of Major Kenneth F. Coykendall, United States Army.
- H.R. 1889, An Act for the relief of Albert Marks.
- H.R. 2881, An Act for the relief of George A. Grabert.
- H.R. 2913, An Act for the relief of Lieutenant Thomas A. Farrell, United States Navy, and others.
- H.R. 8484, An Act to amend section 2634 of title 10, United States Code, relating to the transportation of privately owned motor vehicles of members of the armed forces on a change of permanent station.
- H.R. 8720, An Act to amend the Organic Act of Guam to provide for the payment of legislative salaries and expenses by the government of Guam.
- H.R. 8721, An Act to amend the Revised Organic Act of the Virgin Islands to provide for the payment of legislative salaries and expenses by the government of the Virgin Islands.
