He seated himself and listened to Speaker McCormack's brief introduction REMARKS (live television)  To President's Room flanked by leadership and Luci (on entering the room the President spotted Frank Muto and made a point of shaking hands with him.)  The President SIGNED the Voting Rights Bill, 5.1564  The President gave the first pen to the Vice President and the second to Senator Dirksen. He then gave pens to all members of Congress, negro leaders and then to his Cabinet. At one point he asked for Larry O'Brien and on his arrival gave a pen to him -- and to Dick Goodwin. Several times the President sat down at the desk and signed his name again because of the tremendous demand for signing pens. Before his departure he gathered around him the Speaker, Senator Dirksen, The Vice President, Senator Mansfield, Senator Javits and posed with them for the cameras showing cameras his signature on the bill.
