The President intends to nominate for a term of four years five U.S. Attorneys and four U.S. Marshals. Of these, four U.S. Attorneys and four U.S. Marshals are nominations for reappointment. One U.S. Attorney is a new appointment. He is Donald M. Statton, of Boone, Iowa, to be U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Iowa, for the term of four years, replacing Donald A. Wine, resigned.

The reappointments are:

Bernard J. Brown, of Carbondale, Pennsylvania, to be U.S. Attorney for the Middle District of Pennsylvania, for the term of four years.

Macon L. Weaver, of Birmingham, Alabama, to be U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Alabama, for the term of four years.

Vernol R. Jansen, Jr., of Mobile, Alabama, to be U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Alabama, for the term of four years.

Theodore L. Richling, of Omaha, Nebraska, to be U. S. Attorney for the District of Nebraska, for the term of four years.

Beverly W. Perkins, of Las Vegas, Nevada, to be U.S. Marshal for the District of Nevada, for the term of four years.

Casimir J. Rajakowski, of South Bend, Indiana, to be U.S. Marshal for the Northern District of Indiana, for the term of four years.

James E. Luckie, of Waycross, Georgia, to be U.S. Marshal for the Southern District of Georgia, for the term of four years.

John G. Chernenko, of Wellsburg, West Virginia, to be U.S. Marshal for the Northern District of West Virginia, for the term of four years.
