THE WHITE HOUSE

The President has signed the following bills:

1. HR 10715--- authorizes the Administrator of GSA to dispose of approximately 659,100 short tons of chemical grade chromite excess to the needs of the supplemental stockpile and waives the six-month waiting period that would otherwise be required before disposal.
2. HR 9417----to revise the boundaries of the Jewel Cave National Monument in South Dakota so as to include recently discovered caverns of scenic and scientific interest.
3. HR 4750-- to extend the termination date of the interest equalization tax from December 31, 1965, to July 31, 1967; to broaden the coverage of the tax to include obligations acquired by non-bank investors after February 10, 1965, having a remaining maturity of one year or more; to clarify and extend some exclusions for the inclusion in certain future international agreements of a provision assuring the right of the United States to convert local currencies not required for use within the country into U S. dollars or other foreign currencies.
4. HJ Res 330-to authorize immediate disposal of approximately 33,552 pounds of chromium metal, 4,548 short dry tons of acid grade fluorspar, and 56 short tons of silicon carbide, all excess to the needs of the supplemental stock pile.

5. H. R. 2358-----
t for the relief of Tony Boone (by granting this 17-year old native and citizen of Korea the beneficiary nonquota immigration status by considering him to be an eligible orphan and waiving the provision of general law which limits to two the number of eligible orphan petitions which may be approved for any one citizen couple. Tony is living with an American family in Seoul. He was adopted in August, 1964, by Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Proxmire, who live in Anaheim, California. They are the adoptive parents of three Korean orphan girls and therefore ineligible to petition for a nonquota visa for Tony.
6. H. R. 8035----- to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to accept a donation of the William Floyd Estate in Brookhaven, New York, for addition to the Fire Island National Seashore.
7. H. R. 2091----- to establish in law policies for concessions in areas administered by the National Park Service.
8. H. J. Res. 309----- to increase the number of electric typewriters which the Clerk of the House of Representatives may procure for Members of the House.
9. H. R. 10714----- to authorize the Administrator of the General Services Administration to dispose of approximately 67,600 long dry tons of colemanite now held in the supplemental stockpile and to waive the six-month waiting period that would otherwise be required before disposal.
10. H. R. 10516----- to authorize the Administrator of General Services Administration to dispose of approximately 150,418 long tons of three kinds of vegetable tannin extracts excess to the needs of the national stockpile.

11. H. R. 2772----- to grant to Ksenija Popovic, a two-year old native and citizen of Yugoslavia, the beneficiary nonquota immigration status by considering her to be an eligible orphan. Ksenija was a foundling. She was adopted in Belgrade in January, 1965, by Mrs. Joan Drinkwater Behan of La Jolla, Calif and is presently living in Tijuana, Mexico, in a home provided by Mrs. Behan and is cared for by a nursemaid. Mrs. Behan, who is single, is ineligible to petition for a nonquota visa for Ksenija under eligible orphan provisions of general law.
12. S. 1620----- to consolidate the two judicial districts of the State of South Carolina into a single judicial district.
13. H. R. 7969----- to correct certain errors in the Tariff Schedules of the United States.
