THE PRESIDENT HAS APPROVED THE FOLLOWING:

November 2, 1965

- H. J. Res. 397, Joint Resolution to authorize the Commissioners of the District of Columbia on behalf of the United States to transfer from the United States to the District of Columbia Redevelopment Land Agency title to certain real property in said District.
- H. R. 1317, An Act to provide for the free entry of a mass spectrometer which was imported during May 1963 for the use of Stanford University, Stanford, California.
- H. R. 1781, An Act to amend section 113(a) of title 28, United States Code, to provide that Federal District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina shall be held at Clinton.
- H. R. 2565, An Act to provide for the free entry of one mass spectrometer for the use of the University of Chicago.
- H. R. 3905, An Act for the relief of Bibi Daljeet Kaur.
- H. R. 4088, An Act for the relief of Irving M. Sobin Chemical Company, Incorporated.
- H. R. 5006, An Act for the relief of Diosdado F. Almazan.
- H. R. 8370, An Act making appropriations for the Department of Agriculture and related agencies for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966, and for other purposes.
- H. R. 9545, An Act providing for the acquisition and preservation by the United States of certain items of evidence pertaining to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.
