The President stood up and offered a toast to Princes xMargaret the Queen 10:10a and then made REMARKS welcoming Princess Margaret and her husband. He told her he was glad to have her celebrate him the opening of the 32nd year of married life with one of the most wonderful women in the world -- and offered advice to Lord Snowdon. Princess Margaret responded -- in brief -- she was pleased to be here, she was glad to see the President looking so well, and she was sorry not to be staying longer. She offered a toast to the President. To the East Room for dancing -- the President and Mrs. Johnson and Princess Margaret 10:30a and Lord Snowdon sat at one of the small tables near the center of the room. As Music for dancing by Peter Duchin and his orchestra guests began filing into the room, the President took Princess Margaret to the floor and Lord Snowdon danced with Mrs. Johnson. Then the President danced with Mrs. with a surprise Johnson. The President danced quite a bit during the evening, and was not sitting in appearance by the his chair very much.
