1	9:30 am				Joined by Senator Daniel Inouye, Governor John Burns, Congresswoman Patsy Mink, Miss Kathryn Lanauwau (aide to Mrs. Mink), and Congressman Sparkie Matsunaga	
	9:55 am				Departed the Royal Hawaiian Hotel -- in the car w/ all of the Congressional people plus Governor Burns and Jack Valenti (MF, VM and Miss Lanauwau in another staff car)... and motored to the St. Augustine Catholic Church (church of Gov. Burns)	
C	10:00 am				Arrived at the St. Augustine Church and went inside to attend services. -2512 Kalaakua Honolulu St. The Church was extremely crowded and people were standing on the sides of the pews for the services... (The President nearly fell asleep euring part of the service -- especially where the members of the Church received communion -- the line went on and on and on and JV sitting behind him, nudged him several times	
	11:00				The services ended and the President and party left the church w/ the Priest - Bishop Scanlan and his assistants (alter boys, etc.)...at the entrance of the church the President stopped for a moment and visited w/ the Priest. Then proceeded to the car (it had begun raining just before the party went into the Church and by the time the services had ended, it had stopped)	
	11:05				Departed the Church.....enroute to the Royal Hawaiian Hotel.. Along the way, the streets were lined w/ tourists and natives that had turned out to see the Presidentthe President stopped at a Dairy Queen stand bought 4 ice creams -- shook hands w/ some of the people, waved to the reaminder and returned to his car

	4:37 pm				The President departed the Hotel enroute to Honolulu International Airport. W/ him in the car were Secretary Rusk and Hon. Lloyd Hand and JV and MW	
					Enroute to the airport, it was discovered that the arrival of the AF plane carrying The Viet-Nam officials was to arrive later than expected. They had encountered heavy head-winds...and their arrival was delayed by 15 minutes. (fr. 5:00 pm to 5:15 pm)	
					The Presidential motorcade cruised at a slow speed past the airport and down to Hickman AFB and the entrance of Pearl Harbor -- then turned around and drove back to the International Airport	
	5:12				Arrived at Honolulu International Airport. Crowds were gathered at the airport as they were also along the motorcade route leading into the airport.	
					The President and Secy. Rusk walked over to the plane that had just landed (An American AF plane - 707 that had been dispatched from Washington to Saigon to carry the group.)	
					On the American side , those that were w/ the President but not standing immediately at the aircraft were: Governor and Mrs. John A. Burns General and Mrs. William C. Westmoreland Pacific Commander, US Adm Grant Sharp Senator Daniel K. Inouye Congressman Spark M. Matsunaga Congresswoman Patsy Mink General (ret.) Maxwell Taylor (This group stood at an area adjacent to the platform where the President was to speak)

					The door opened at both ends of the aircraft and the press aboard deplaned for the coverage of the ceremonies... then came the officials.	
					The President and Secy. Rusk shook hands w/ H. E. Vice Marshall Nguyen Cao Ky - Prime Minister of Viet-Nam H. E. Lt. Gen. Nguyen Van Thieu - Chairman of the National Leadership Committee (and Chief of State)	
					Mdme Nguyen Cao Ky Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge Ambassador Lloyd Hand did the introductions	
					The President and Prime Chief of State Nguyen Van Thieu -- stood at attention on the platform while the American and Viet-Nam national anthems were played... there followed a 21-gun salute. (Because of the bad weather, the smoke from the cannons filtered over to the crowd making the area very dismal and gray and serious)	
					Then the President and Chief of State Van Thieu reviewed the troops	
					Returned to the platform for remarks	
					REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT The President welcomed the leaders of the Vietnamese Republic ---- then made a very serious speech on the war taking place in Viet-Nam and how America was pledged to halt aggression of any form that leads to the oppression of free peoples . He said -- "Our stand must be as firm as ever" and commented how America had stood firm in Europe and now must to do in other parts of the world. He talked of the hopes that both leaders of America and Viet-Nam held for the meetings in the next days -- "in order that we may best move forward together."

					After the remarks of Van Thieu, the President and his dignitaries walked to the reception committee (consisting of those mentioned earlier from the American side...) The President introduced each member of Viet-Nam to the Americans... and they then proceeded to the waiting limousines.	
	5:44				Departed the Honolulu International Airport --- With the President in his car were: Hon. Lloyd Hand Chief of State Nguyen Van Thieu H. E. and Mdme Nguyen Cao Ky	
	6:07				Arrived at the Princess Kaiulani Hotel in Honolulu. This is the hotel where members of the Viet-Nameese official party were staying (only a few blocks from the Royal Hawaiian Hotel) The Presidential motorcade drove there and the President bid farewell to his guests... he walked them to their suite... then returned to his limousine and returned to the Royal Hawaiian Hotel -- departing at 6:17 pm (Outside of the P. K. hotel were pickets demonstrating against the war in Viet-Nam---- these were ignored by members of both parties)	
	6:19				Arrived at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel and the President went to his suite w/ Hon. Lloyd Hand, Hon. Marvin Watson, Hon. Jack Valenti, and MF and VM and Governor Burns. The President sat in his suite -- commenting on the activities that had preceded his return to the Hotel... talking to staff members and Gov. Burns listening...
