Henry H. Fowler, of Virginia, to be United States Governor of the Asian Development Bank.

William S. Gaud, of Connecticut, to be United States Alternate Governor of the Asian Development Bank.

Bernard Zagorin, of Virginia, to be United States Director of the Asian Development Bank.

William N. Goodwin, of Washington, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern and Western Districts of Washington to fill a new position created by P.L. 87-36, approved May 19, 1961.

Harry M. Miller, of Kentucky, to be United States Marshal for the Western District of Kentucky for the term of four years. (Reappointment)

Robert LaFollette Bennett, of Alaska, to be Commissioner of Indian Affairs.
