The mtg started kut with the President indicating to the entire group that they must be for all of the package and not just for parts of it. He stressed that this was important because the difficulty with its being a piece of legislation was enough without the added handicap of its supporters being splintered. He discussed briefly the loss of the Teacher Corps and the rent supplement vote to illustrate his point. he then had the VP read through the message itself with his coming in with explanations at specific points and also with the Attorney General making comments. - 6:05 PM USAF #26000 arrived at Houston International Airport. (See Attachment No. 4 - USAF #26000 Passenger List.) Upon deplaning, the President, Mrs. Johnson, and Miss Luci were greeted by a small reception committee. (See Attachment No. 5 - Reception Committee.)
- 6:10 PM Presidential motorcade departed from Houston International Airport. (See Attachment No. 6 - Motorcade Assignments.)
- 6:37 PM Presidential motorcade arrived at the Shamrock-Hilton Hotel, were greeted by General Manager James J. Spring and Resident Manager Eric Hilton, and were immediately escorted to the Presidential Suite, Room 1653. (See Attachment No. 7 - Room Assignments.)
- 7:00 PM President Johnson, accompanied by Governor Connolly, attended a small reception in the International Room of the Shamrock-Hilton Hotel.

- 7:35 PM Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Connelly attended the reception in the International Room.
- 8:05 PM The President and Mrs. Johnson, accompanied by Governor and Mrs. Connelly, departed the International Room and walked to the Regency Room for the Presidential Ball. (Photographs were taken upon departure from International Room.)
- 10:14 PM Mr. Ralph McCullough introduced Governor Connelly.
- 10:15 PM Governor Connelly introduced the President. President Johnson addressed the dinner guests.
- 10:55 PM The President concluded his speech. Dance music by Henry King's Orchestra; the President danced with Mrs. Johnson.
- 11:00 PM Entertainment by Danny Thomas.
- 11:50 PM Danny Thomas concluded his entertainment; the President and Mrs. Johnson departed the ballroom and walked to his awaiting limousine via the colonade and main hotel lobby.
