NOMINATIONS SENT TO THE SENATE ON JUNE 20, 1966:

John H. Crimmins, of Maryland, a Foreign Service Officer of Class one, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Dominican Republic.

Richard Helms, of the District of Columbia, to be Director of Central Intelligence.

Winthrop Knowlton, of New York, to be an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, vice Merlyn N. Trued, resigned.

Samuel M. Nabrit, of Texas, to be a Member of the Atomic Energy Commission for the remainder of the term expiring June 30, 1970.

Gerald F. Tape, of New York, to be a Member of the Atomic Energy Commission for a term of five years expiring June 30, 1971. (Reappointment)

Rosel H. Hyde, of Idaho, to be a Member of the Federal Communications Commission for the unexpired term of seven years from July 1, 1962.
