Kennedy, one of the oldest living holders of the Medal of Honor Secretary Resor read the citation, the President draped the medal around Lt. Williams' neck and presented him the framed certificate. When the President introduced Brig Gen Kennedy, he brought him to the rostrum, and placed him at his right hand side and introduced him personally to Lieutenant Williams. At the conclusion of the ceremony, the President asked Lt. Williams to introduce him to the rest of his family, and the Medal of Honor winner went over the first and second rows of gests on the right hand side of the room -- and so the President met all members of his family. Then the President guided Lt. Williams to the guests seated on the left hand side of the room--members of the Congress, government officials, etc, and the President introduced him to those guests personally. A Receiving Line was set up, and the President personally shook hands with each guest. At the end of the receiving line, the President told Lt. Williams that he understood he had a date with the press, and the President invited Lt Williams to walk over to the West side with him. The President stopped outside the North Portico door and posed for photographers...w/ Lt Williams on his left and Mrs Williams on his right and children and family trailing behind. At this point the President picked up the three year old, Shannon, and asked her if he could carry her . She was a warm youngster and responded well to the President. About half way down the walk to the Lobby she became restless, and the President put her down, saying, "You know, you remind me very much of my ood friend, Courtenay." Once inside the Lobby, the President invited the Williams to come to his office to see it, the Fish Room and surrounding area. He said goodbye to the Williams in the Fish Room, saying to Shannon, "I've known you for a long time now, long enough for you to give me a big hug and a kiss."
