	INSERT 1:15	pm			Francis Bator sent a memo in for the President -- he called before it arrived to say that the President would probably want to see it when it arrived.	
					The memo - confidential said in part that "w/ the exception of the Yugoslavs, the East Europeans -- and the Russians -- are all shifting from acceptances to regrets for tonight. but if this sort of thing is all they will do in response to Hanoi and Haiphong, we should not be too upset."	
					Upon reading the memo, the President asked vm to call Mr. Bator and ask him what he meant... vm did so, and Mr. Bator explained that previously all of the East European countries had accepted invitations to be guests of the President this evening, and now in view of the President's remarks, they had called in saying that they were ill, out of town, etc. VM relayed that information to the President, and he then asked that each country be listed by name, and to find out the reason why they were not regretting, and when they did so.	
					VM called the Protocol office at State Dept. and talked w/ Mrs. Newton there who furnished the following information:	
					"Bulgaria -- Has not regretted officially - but last night at a social function, one of the Embassy officials told our Bulgarian desk officer, that the Charge had been called out of town unexpectedly, and probably would not return in time to attend. They did not offer a substitute.	
					Czechoslovakia -- The Charge called this morning at 10:15 am and regretted -- Gave no explanation.	
					Hungary -- The office of the Charge called this morning at 10:43 am Said the Charge was ill and would not attend.	
					Rumania -- The office of the Charge called this morning at 9:15 am -- Gave no explanation.	
					Soviets -- Called yesterday and said that the Charge was ill and probably would not be able to attend. (Note: When the invitation was extended to the Ambassador, he said that he would not be able to attend, and asked if his Charge could substitute for him... The Charge never officially accepted at all -- State feels that because of the lateness of the invitation extended to the Charge, there really wasn't time for him to accept or regret - vm)... The Embassy has not called today w/ anything.

THE WHITE HOUSE

President Johnson today announced the appointment of an Advisory Council on College Library Resources.

The Council will establish criteria for special-purpose and supplemental grants to colleges and universities for the purchase of library books, periodicals, documents, magnetic tapes, phonograph records, and audiovisual materials.
