MEMORANDUM FOR MRS. JUANITA ROBERTS

SUBJECT: Cabinet Meeting, July 15, 1966

Following is a summary of the Cabinet Meeting held July 15, 1966. All Members of the Cabinet were present, except Secretary Freeman who was represented by Under Secretary John Schnittker. The Vice President also was not present.

The President followed the agenda as contained in the President's black book of the agenda for the Cabinet meeting. He read, as he decided to do ahead of time, the written remarks contained in the book concerning Secretary Rusk's report on the Pacific visit and Secretary McNamara's report on the Vietnam military operations.

The President also read the written remarks concerning the need for fiscal restraints and Secretary Fowler and Director Schultze made brief remarks concerning the need for economy on the Executive side and stressed that every effort should be made to prevent appropriations by Congress over the budget.

The President also introduced Secretary Gardner in accordance with the text of the book, and Secretary Gardner gave a brief report on the success of Medicare. The President introduced the Postmaster General in accordance with the text in the book, and the Postmaster General reviewed each piece of legislation with the appropriate Members of the Cabinet, as indicated in the memorandum from the Postmaster General to the President as contained in the black book.

The President did not use the concluding remarks because of lack of time, but he did ask Secretary Wirtz to give a brief report of the airline strike; Secretary Fowler to give a brief report on a higher ^{interest} ~~income~~ rate; and Attorney General Katzenbach to discuss ethical codes within the Government, particularly in relation to use of private planes by government officials.
