Korrry (Mrs. Johnson spoke to him quite a bit, though), but in answer to a question from Bill Moyers concerning the President's favorite governors, the President replied, "That when you think of men who love the people and love the land, you think of Pa Ferguson, and then to a lesser degree, Jimmy Allred."
