MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

Mr. Watson arranged for a small reception in the Staff Mess in the West Wing on Thursday, August 18th at 6:00 p.m., for the Telephone Operators so that the President's Staff would have an opportunity to greet them personally now that the new switchboard is in operation and express their appreciation for the operators' helpfulness and devotion to duty. Mr. Watson indicated that he hoped that it would be possible for the President to attend but that such word should not be passed on to the operators until there was some certainty that the President's schedule would not prevent this.

The President came to the gathering at approximately 6:30 p.m. and was accompanied by Mr. Watson, Senator Long, of Louisiana, and Congressman Brooks, of Texas. After greeting each of the operators present at that time he had his picture taken with them and talked with them informally as he was grouped with them after the pictures were taken. In addition to expressing his appreciation to them he indicated that steps were being taken to have a Civil Service survey of the operators' position to see if any adjustments should be made in their behalf.

Since it was necessary for a number of the operators to man the board the operators who had already been greeted by the President relieved them and were replaced by the others. During the interim the President waited for the new group to come over and spent the time chatting with the members of his Staff present and reminiscing with Arthur Perry about some of his early days in Washington.

The President repeated for the second group of operators what he had done for the first. He left the gathering with those who had accompanied him there in the neighborhood of 7:00 p.m.

Of the twenty-three operators, twenty were in attendance at the reception and the Chief Operator has indicated that all of them were deeply grateful and highly appreciative of this personal recognition by the President. He had given the ladies a bracelet as a memento of the occasion and the young men a tie clasp.
