MEMORANDUM FOR MRS. JUANITA ROBERTS

The President held a regular Cabinet Meeting on Wednesday, September 7, at 12 noon. He followed the agenda that he had with him, as did the two major participants -- Secretary Fowler and Postmaster General O'Brien. There were general discussions on the Administration's monetary policy and discussions of individual legislation before Congress.

Those in attendance were the same as listed in the President's book.

In addition, the President read from a summary of his press conferences todate, together with comparisons with those of the previous Administration. He also read off a comparison of the Secretaries¹ television appearances, etc. of his Cabinet compared to that of the previous Administration. The President also asked Members of the Cabinet to inform me of their travel plans between now and November. He in turn said if any Members of the Cabinet were going to take unusual absences the Members of the Cabinet should notify me.

The President later told me that he would like to see these schedules and I have been supplying them to him.
