"The President, accompanied by Dr. Heller, joined the breakfast guests. Dr. Heller and the President were engrossed in conversation about the government income and expenditures under the Accrual Income Account. The President commented that so few people realized that the actual cash income of the government was exceeding expenditures. (Dr. Heller departed almost immediately.) Since the guests had breakfasted, they had coffee and the President had juice and coffee. Mr. Heath talked about the formal Presidential Library and school announcement to be made following the Sept 30 meeting of the Board of Regents. In this connection he discussed the politics and City Council of Austin and problems with the Roads Commission since certain roads would be closed because of the site. It was the President's feeling that the announcement should be made later, after the Texas elections. It should merely be stated that the models are not ready for viewing. Conversation then turned to the surfacing of the building--granite, field stone, travertine. The President was not partial to Texas shell; he knew about the weathering and problems associated with its use." --DT:mjdr:mf - from Dr. Grover

MEMORANDUM FOR MRS. JUANITA ROBERTS

The President held a regular Cabinet Meeting on Wednesday, September 7, at 12 noon. He followed the agenda that he had with him, as did the two major participants -- Secretary Fowler and Postmaster General O'Brien. There were general discussions on the Administration's monetary policy and discussions of individual legislation before Congress.

Those in attendance were the same as listed in the President's book.

In addition, the President read from a summary of his press conferences to date, together with comparisons with those of the previous Administration. He also read off a comparison of the Secretaries' television appearances, etc. of his Cabinet compared to that of the previous Administration. The President also asked Members of the Cabinet to inform me of their travel plans between now and November. He in turn said if any Members of the Cabinet were going to take unusual absences the Members of the Cabinet should notify me.

The President later told me that he would like to see these schedules and I have been supplying them to him.
