	4:21p				Arrived Newark, New Jersey downtown -- good crowds on the streets One woman who looked as if she worked in a kitchen, held out her white apron on which were lettered the words, "How is Luci?" The President answered, using his car speaker, "She's fine... running her house." Along the streets, many people were waiting, and the President used his car speaker to greet them as the car moved along. At one point, the President left his car-- beside two buses parked on the streets. The President boarded the busses -- the Verona Avenue City Bus, and the South Broadstreet Bus. He shook hands with the passengers and asked one negro lady where she was going. "I'se going down to see you," [REDACTED] the lady said. "Well, I better get off so you can get going," replied the President.
