All during this time the Maoris were chanting, and the scene could have been one of much excitement, but the excitement was down because of the rains which were falling. A cordon of RNZAF men was broken by Maoris who joined the line made to serve as sort of a receiving line to the aidcraft. The President shook hands w/ the axmadxxxxxxxxxx RNZAF men as well as the Maoris on the way to the aircraft. 5:00p The President and the Prime Minister boarded a RNZAF DC-6 aircraft (stopping at the top of the stairs to wave at the crowd) The ladies had boarded earlier because of the rain and were waiting for the gentlemen in the cabin in the rear section of the plane.
