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					Just before landing, the President came to the conference room and signed thank you letters for Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur	
	2:57p				Wheels down - Seoul, Korea, Kimpo International Airport. Mr. Yi Pom Suk, Chief Protocol Officer, and Amb and Mrs. Brown came to the plane steps, boarded the ramp and came into the rear of Air Force One to greet the President and Mrs. Johnson. As the President and Mrs. Johnson walked down the flower-bedecked ramp, they were greeted by President and Mrs. Park of Korea. President Park--through an interpreter, presented to the President: <del>President</del> Speaker of the National Assembly and Mrs. Rhee Chief Justice and Mrs. Cho Prime Minister and Mrs Chong Foreign Minister and Mrs. Lee and members of the Cabinet and Diplomatic Corps	
					Then the two Presidents and their wives went to the Review stand for National Anthems, 21-gun salute, and review of <del>Knox</del> Honor Guard. While the review was in progress there was a fly-over by ROK Air Force jets w/ colored con trails. Red, white, and blue smoke trailed from the planes. The two Presidents then boarded a jeep for a review of the guard. Then a receiving line for Korean and Americans .	
					Good crowds at the airport, colorfully decorated and dressed ladies. Flags flying, and every person in the crowd seemed to have a paper flag.	
	3:20p				Into car - for motorcade w/ President Park and two interpreters.	
					Many bands along the route, and soldiers at attention all the way	



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	3:29p				Motorcade stopped - while press busses were allowed to catch up. For some reason they had not departed the airport with the motorcade, and there was much talk between Moyers and Secret Service about stopping the President's car in time to allow the press buses to catch up. At this time the President got out of his car to shake hands. He then went down into a rice paddy and visited w/ and shook hands w/ a group of children.	
	3:33p				Motorcade moving again. The Press buses had caught up with the motorcade, and the President got back into his car. A frantic call came back to the staff car from the agent riding with the President asking for a clean pair of black shoes. No shoes were available, as the luggage had gone to Emerald House, Walker Hill. Sgt Glynn suggested they use a cold towel provided in the car and clean the President's <del>saxxwith</del> shoes with it.  Along the road were Korean women dressed in the China Chojan with <del>xxxxxxx</del> turned up rubber shoes -- factory workers dressed in white <del>saxx</del> scarves and blue overalls.  Motorcade passed many very interesting pictures and signs -- drawn and made by school children.  The President is the first head of state to visit Korea since Eisenhower, and Mrs. Johnson is the first First Lady of any country to ever come to visit Korea.  As the motorcade passed a Max Factor <del>xxxxx</del> plant, all the employees were observed outside the plant holding Welcome Signs. <del>saxx</del> Th signs spelled out the words, "Welcome Johnson."	
	3:45p				Motorcade stopped again -- walked over to crowds on the right of the road... at <del>Koro</del> Koro Road. The President, standing by the side of the crowd, moving and shaking hands with large numbers of the people. -- <del>xbac chaccoc</del> then to the other side of the road -- warmly greeted by crowd -- almost mobbed.	

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	3:51p				Motorcade moving again.	
					Wonderful pictures designed by the school children -- "We love Johnny"	
					At this point there was a slight scare. A young student in his enthusiasm broke from the crowd, and ran toward the President's car. An agent stopped him and through him back into the crowd.	
					Scores of balloons were released, and over the sky one could see 5,000 pigeons released. Sign - "Let's plant the seed of Democracy in Asia."	
					Many of the signs had a spanish or western motif. -- much, much confetti being thrown, some of it caught on the aerial of the President's car and the streamers made the car look like a moving rainbow. -- a sign - "LBJ, the great leader of the world."	
					<del>Crow</del> Crowds so large the police barriers were breaking down.	
					Signs - "Nice country, nice guest." -- "We are your best friends."	
					Not one unfriendly face was spotted -- not one unfriendly sigh	
					Crowds were so excited -- jumping up and down	
	4:11p				Stopped motorcade - standing on running board -- waving to the people -- then waving and shaking hands -- touching finger tips w/ people	
	4:19p				Back to car.	
	4:21p				Stopped again (at this point, <del>on</del> the Prime Minister told our Ambassador that this was the biggest crowd he had seen since Independence)	
	4:26p				Moving again.	

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					The Secret Service had to stop the motorcade to clear the President's car of confetti. The confetti was jamming the air conditioning vents in the President's car.	
					Then over the Han River Bridge	
					Baloons again being released -- many, many people -- at least six-eight heads deep along the route.	
	4:34p				Stopped again -- beautiful girls in Korean national dress. 300-400	
	4:39p				Moving again	
					The <del>word</del> word "Johnson" in Korean means "good & guest"	
	4:42p				Stopped again - out of the car, surrounded by people, holding two flags	
Motorcade Route Ten Miles					The President took an American flag and a Korean flag, and waved them to the crowd -- one in each hand.	
	4:46p				Moving again - slowly, having trouble getting car through crowds, agents running along side trying to clear the people from out of the front of the car.	
					Crowds now throwing fresh flowers.	
	4:57p				Arrived City Hall	
					crowd of at least 300,000. Secy Rusk said later that as far as he could see, even on the side streets, people lined the streets. -- live television coverage.	
					Mayor and Mrs. Kim greeted the two Presidents and escorted them to the Reception Stand. Wild ovations -- WHCA had 27 speakers throughout the crowd to enable all to hear. Girls in pink national dress.	



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					On the platform, Mayor Kim presented the Key to the City to the President.	
					President Park made welcoming speech	
	5:17p				The President responded - live television coverage for his REMARKS (at official welcoming ceremony) ten applauses, plus the one at the end	
	5:31p				Motorcade departed City Hall - en route the Capitol Building	
	5:32p	5:33p			Motorcade stopped -	
	5:35p				Stopped again - huge crowds, girls in kimonos, throwing bouquets of fresh flowers, the President's car just covered in flowers.	
	5:37p				President back in car - at this point a band moved into the street, and let the motorcade to the Capitol Building.	
	5:45p				Motorcade stopped again - President on the running board, and the car moving very slowly.	
	5:48p				Quick stop, and then car moving slowly again -- bands playing, police whistling crowds screaming	
	5:50p				Arrived Capitol Building helicopter pad, having driven <del>thru</del> through a colorfully garbed crowd of girls in native dress. --the President got out his car and shook hands with many of the girls.
