The President pointed out some land that he had recently sold, also pointing out that he had kept the land with the trees on it. While in the boat, the President appeared very happy and relaxed, obviously enjoying his moments on the lake. There were no press people around, and it was a pretty sunny day.

					The President then took Mr. & Mrs. Kintner and Ambassador Harriman out in the little blue aqua-car. The Ambassador and Mrs. Kintner took the trip very calmly, saying that they had complete <del>ix</del> faith in the President and that besides, the water appeared shallow at the spot the car was entering the water! Mr. Kintner, however, provided the President his fun, and appeared really frightened--the President had much fun kidding him about it the remainder of the afternoon.

					At the Krim residence, the President showed the guests through, as proudly as if it were his. He commented how cute and pretty and nice he thought it was. While in the area, he drove the group to show them the point of land that Ambassador B Goldberg is considering building upon, although the President said he thought that it was merely idle talk on the Ambassadors part.	
	3:21-				Depart the Krim Place by chopper	
					While in the air, the chopper flew over a burning pasture. The President had Major Rice circle until he was satisfied that there were enough people fighting the blaze and that it was under control. He then leaned back in his <del>cxk</del> chair and relaxed the remainder of the flight.	
	3:38p				Arrive the LBJ Ranch-- the pPresident brought Ambassador Harriman, Horace Busby, and Mr. Kintner, and J. C. Kellam back to the Main House by Golf Cart	
	4:05p				The President departed the Main House by car (President driving) with Mrs. Johnson Ambassador Harriman, Mr. & Mrs. Kintner, and Horace Busby--for the jetstar pad to say good bye to the guests. Before leaving the President gave Amb Harriman a color album of ranch pics, a knife, and in the morning he had given the small bust by Jemilu Mason to the Ambassador. The Ambassador was obviously moved and very appreciative.
