1:55pm - President and party arrive Methodist Church

2:00pm - Church Services begin -

2:45pm- Church Services conclude

3:05pm - Funeral cortege departs Church
(1.1 miles)

3:08pm - Funeral cortege arrives Cemetery

3:25pm - Graveside Services begin. (President and Mrs. Johnson to stand
behind family due to brevity of services)

3:30pm - Graveside services conclude.

At church, casket will be open after services for viewing of body.
